### Leasing & Business Development

The following items are tentatively scheduled to appear before City Council in December:

- Lease extension for Coast Storage, which is currently located on Airport property on Pixie Avenue in the City of Lakewood.
- Reciprocal easement with The Boeing Company for Airport property on Wardlow Road.
- A lease with Long Beach City College for the use of 750 parking spaces in the Veterans Memorial Stadium Parking Lot for holiday overflow parking starting December 22 thru January 2.
- Chevron Corporation has notified the City of its intention to cease operations at the corner of Lakewood Blvd. and Donald Douglas Drive on January 1, 2009. The City is in negotiations with Chevron's operator at the site for a proposed separate lease for continued operations.

### Construction Update

- Taxiway Charlie is now open. The next phase of Taxiway K has commenced and is scheduled to be completed in approximately 12 months.
- Taxiway Kilo is closed from Runway 16-34R to Runway 12-30.
- Taxiway KI, K2, K3 and 16L connector to Runway 7L-25R are closed.
- Helicopter pads 3 & 4 and the north blimp mooring site are closed for construction laydown area to support the Taxiway K project. This construction laydown area is also the storage area for the recycled pavement material, as we recycle the materials to be placed back in the taxiway project.

### Alaska Adds New Service to Portland

Alaska Airlines announced a new twice-daily nonstop service between Portland, Ore., and Long Beach starting February 8, 2009. The addition of Portland-Long Beach gives customers another convenient alternative for traveling between the Pacific Northwest and Southern California.

### Vision Airlines Begins New Service to Laughlin

Vision Airlines has begun private charter service between Long Beach and Laughlin, Nevada in conjunction with vacation packages at Don Laughlin's Riverside Resort and Casino. Flights arrive and depart on Fridays and Mondays via Signature Flight Support.

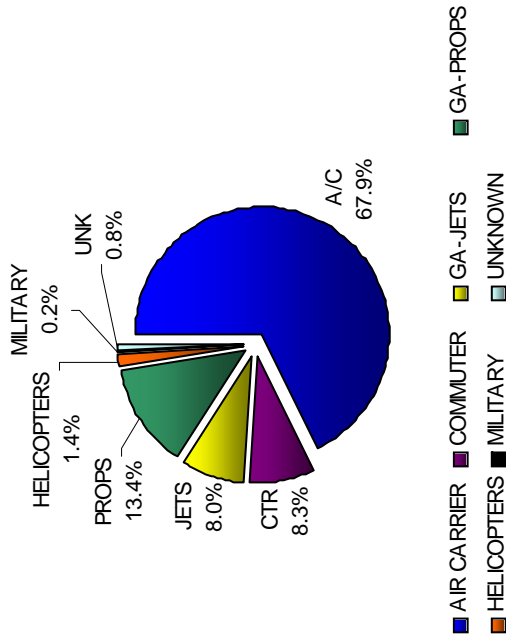

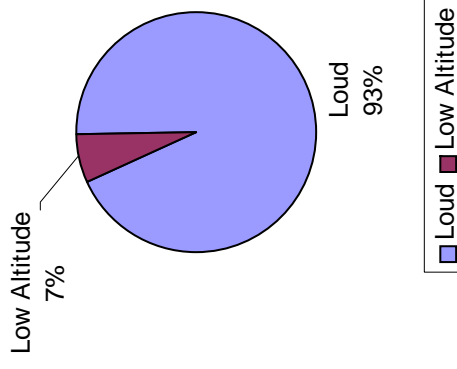

**Complaint Concern**

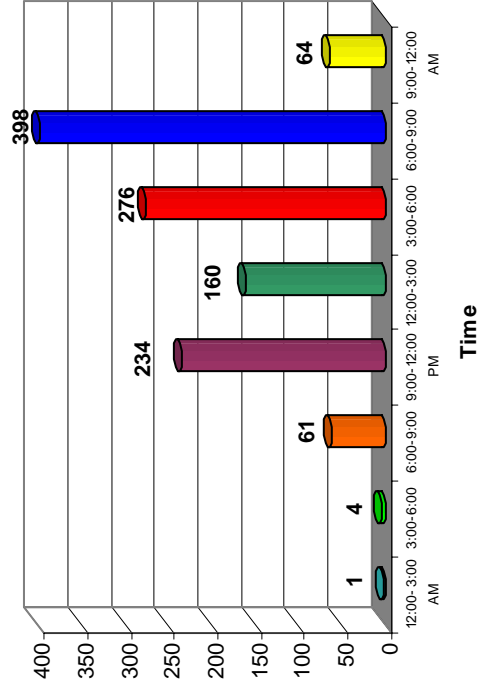
