JetBlue Fined \$48,000 for July Noise Violations

To put the one-month, \$48,000 fine in perspective, that's 85% of the total fine amount for the entire second quarter (Apr/May/Jun) of 2016. A breakdown of the JetBlue late-night operations and violations for July shows 11 operations after 11:00 pm that resulted in Consent Decree violations. The first six Consent Decree violations were \$3,000 each, and the next five Consent Decree violations were \$6,000 each for a total of \$48,000. Any subsequent Consent Decree violations in August and September will result in fines of \$6,000 each.



In addition, JetBlue conducted a total of 21 operations in between 10:00 pm and 11:00 pm. All 21 of these operations qualified as unanticipated delays, and the delays were primarily due to mechanical problems with aircraft and poor weather conditions on the east coast. All of the data is preliminary pending the final verification of times, noise levels and unanticipated delay status. Thanks to Ryan McMullen, Airport Operations Specialist - Noise Analyst II, for providing the data.

FY 2017 Budget Release at Fire Station No. 8

On Monday morning, Mayor Robert Garcia and City Manager Pat H. West presented the City of Long Beach's Proposed Fiscal Year 2017 Budget. The \$2.6 billion budget benefits from \$35.6 in revenue generated by Measure A for public safety and infrastructure. Highlights among the proposed budget include:

- Re-establish the Police Department's South Division
- Restore Fire Engine 8
- One Police Recruit Academy
- Two Fire Recruit Academies
- New positions for Economic Development for improved service
- Minimum wage enforcement
- Two Beach Streets events
- Clean Team funding
- Park Tree trimming
- Water conservation efforts
- Homeless Services outreach
- Language Access Plan funding



- Be SAFE funding
- Continues Sunday library hours
- Los Angeles River Study led by Frank Gehry

The airline also announce additional flights to Las Vegas, Salt Lake City and San Francisco. The city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcasted live [online](#) and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are some of the topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's city council meeting:



- The Council will consider making the Federal Inspection Services (FIS) Feasibility Study publicly available and posted on relevant City websites at least 15 days before scheduling any City Council meeting to allow public review and input.
- The Council will consider a request to create a comprehensive plan to recruit and include Long Beach businesses in all contracts (professional and non-professional) and purchasing agreements.

100 Days of Summer 2016


