


East Anaheim Street Corridor between Termino and Redondo

LBFD Logs Nearly 500 CD4 Response Calls in June

The map below plots all the LBFD response calls for the month of

June in Council District 4. Included in the total are 416 medical (84%) and 50 fire (10%) responses. An engine company is the only fire apparatus capable of carrying and pumping water. The western end of the Fourth is covered by Engine 10 stationed in Council District 6. The eastern end of the Fourth is covered by Engine 22 stationed in Council District 3. In the center of the Fourth is Fire Station 17, but there is no engine company at that station. It was eliminated years ago due to budget cuts. Restoration of Engine 17 would provide full fire coverage for our entire council district (and portions of CD3 and CD5 covered by Engine 17). It would also relieve the strain on a very busy Station 10 by eliminating the need to cover parts of Station 17's area.

Southwest Airlines Adding Flights Out of LGB



As authorized by the City's Airport Noise Compatibility Ordinance, Southwest Airlines has formally requested the temporary reallocation of unused flight slots as allowed under the Flight

Allocation Resolution. The unused flight slots are currently allocated for, but not fully utilized by, JetBlue. On Wednesday, the required notifications went to both airlines that the request was approved. Southwest Airlines has reserved three unused flight slots for use Sunday through Friday, and two unused flight slots for use on

Saturday, beginning September 18 through December 31, 2016, and will maintain compliance with the City's Airport Noise Compatibility Ordinance. Southwest will announce their destination sites in the near future. You can read the full press release [here](#).

Concerts at the Beach this Saturday



CD4's Tony Azevedo headed to Rio for Olympics



What's Next on the Council Agenda: July 19, 2016

The city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcasted live [online](#) and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are some of the topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's city council meeting:



- There will be swearing in ceremonies for Council Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8. In addition, the City Council will be selecting a new Vice Mayor.
- There will be a presentation to celebrate the 90th birthday of former Fourth District Councilman and Mayor, Dr. Tom Clark, during the City Council Meeting.
- The City Council will be discussing Mayor Robert Garcia's non charter commission and board appointments and reappointments.
- The City Council will discuss entering into a contract with Bitech Construction Co., Inc. for the construction of the El Dorado Nature Center. This Improvement Project, which is the next element of the Master Plan, consists primarily of the enhancement of the main entryway, signage and the replacement of the pedestrian bridge connecting the entry to the island.

This week, repaving was completed on Roswell Ave, Fountain St. and Belmont Ave. The project also included new curbs/gutters, sections of sidewalk and ADA curb cuts where needed. We have received many positive comments from these neighborhoods that have gone a very long time without infrastructure improvements. The District 4 office will continue to address these issues on a "greatest need" basis... independent of where there are located within the district.
