



scheduled. Two years passed, and in 2008, the City told the resident they would not be doing the work after all. Mr. Shadrick related the story to me last week, and I immediately contacted the Water Dept. Within 24 hours, Chris Garner, GM of the Water Dept, approved the repairs, and the work was completed in just one week. Thanks to Chris Garner for a quick response and great customer service.
