Virgin Orbit's Cosmic Girl Arrives at LGB

Monday afternoon, I was at the Long Beach Airport as Virgin Orbit's Cosmic Girl Boeing 747 aircraft arrived. The aircraft is a former Virgin Atlantic 747-400 passenger jet with modifications enabling it to launch a rocket that Virgin Orbit calls LauncherOne. The idea is for Cosmic Girl to be able to carry LauncherOne under one of its wings and fire the rocket spaceward like a giant missile.

FY 2018 Budget Hearing at City Council Last Tuesday

Tuesday afternoon, the City Council conducted a Budget Hearing for the proposed 2018 budget. The City of Long Beach has an annual budget of approximately \$2.65 billion. The vast majority of the City's resources are designated, by law, for certain purposes. The only portion of the budget that is completely discretionary is the General Fund, which accounts for only 17 percent (\$461 million) of the total budget. The General Fund provides much of the resources for critical City services, including police patrol, fire response, parks and recreation, library services, and streets and sidewalks. 
Long Beach, City of Seal Beach and San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy.

Next on the Council Agenda: August 8th

The city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here is one of the topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's city council meeting:

- The City Council will discuss expanding Preferential Parking District "U" in the Los Altos neighborhood
- The City Council will hear a presentation from the Hospitality Industry about their contributions to the Long Beach economy
- The City Council will consider accepting a grant for capital improvements to Runway 7R-25L at the Long Beach Airport
- The City Council will discuss authorizing the purchase of playground equipment for 5 parks including Whaley Park
- The City Council will hear the first reading of the ordinance related to parking of oversized vehicles

Citywide Underground Survey

A private survey group is performing an underground mapping survey throughout the City. The purpose of the survey is to map underground conditions beneath the City's surface, to help identify additional oil reserves. The survey will be done in two phases. The first phase will calibrate 3,000 underground sensors located in the City's streets and parkways. Green markings may be added to some parkways as a method of identifying potential future sensors locations. Phase two will begin in September 2017 and consist of underground mapping of pre-selected streets. The underground mapping process is performed by a slow-moving caravan of three trucks and a police escort. Residents with

Free Concert and Movie at Stearns Park Next Friday Night


The Shoreline Symphonic Winds will be performing at Stearns Champions Park next Friday, August 11. They feature popular movie and action themes like Superman, Raiders,

El Dorado Nature Center



Looking for a bit of nature in the middle of the city? Nestled between the San Gabriel River and the 605 Freeway, El Dorado Nature Center is an oasis of natural habitat, offering visitors the chance to escape the hustle and bustle of the urban environment.

The 105 acres that make up the Nature Center grounds provide sanctuary for animals and plant life. Two miles of dirt trails and a ¼ mile paved trail wind around two lakes, a stream and forested areas. At the entrance, cross over the wooden bridge that spans the lake and you'll find yourself on a small island that houses the Visitor Center, containing educational displays, art gallery and a small gift shop offering environmentally themed books and gifts.
