

The evidence is contained in the chart below that shows the noise violation fines for each year from 2012 to present. You'll notice the column on the far right exceeds the annual dollar amount of all the others. Here's the kicker: it's for only the first half of 2017!

It is clearly time to look for solutions, and we're anticipating a major announcement on that front within the next 30 days.




Shoreline Symphonic Winds Tonight!

Zika Community Assessment this Weekend

Tomorrow morning, I will be joining the outreach team for the Zika community assessment. From July 20th through 22nd, the Long Beach Department of Health and Human Services, along with the California Department of Public Health, will be conducting a Zika Community Assessment for Public Health Emergency Response (CASPER). Over three days, approximately 80 personnel from the City's Health, Police and Fire Departments, California Public Health, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, staff from neighboring jurisdictions, and community volunteers will be deployed to the field to ask Long Beach residents questions to assess their knowledge of mosquito behavior, Zika, and how to protect against mosquito-borne illnesses. Los Alamitos Traffic Circle in 1956

This aerial photo was taken in 1956 from the south side of the traffic circle facing north. That's Lakewood Blvd. at the top with Los Coyotes Diag. at the upper right and PCH south at the lower right. PCH north is at the middle left. The only commercial building in the shot that still exists today is the large white structure at the bottom right. It was originally built as a Robert Hall Clothing store. The address is 4300 E. PCH, and it is now the headquarters of FreeConferenceCall.com.

Also of note are the two open concrete culverts in the center of the traffic circle. The design is identical to that of the open ditch that ran along the north side of Atherton Street between McNab and Knoxville.

El Dorado Nature Center



Looking for a bit of nature in the middle of the city? Nestled between the San Gabriel River and the 605 Freeway, El Dorado Nature Center is an oasis of natural habitat, offering visitors the chance to escape the hustle and bustle of the urban environment.

The 105 acres that make up the Nature Center grounds provide sanctuary for animals and plant life. Two miles of dirt trails and a ¼ mile paved trail wind around two lakes, a stream and forested areas. At the entrance, cross over the wooden bridge that spans the lake and you'll find yourself on a small island that houses the Visitor Center, containing educational displays, art gallery and a small gift shop offering environmentally themed books and gifts.
