Past Events

JetBlue Fined \$85,200 for April Noise Violations

The LGB Noise Office has reviewed JetBlue late-night operations and violations for the month of April. All of the data is preliminary pending the final verification of times, noise levels and unanticipated delay status. JetBlue conducted 17 operations after 11:00 pm. All of these operations resulted in Consent Decree violations/fines. For the month of April, the first six Consent Decree violations resulted in a fine of \$3,000 each, and subsequent Consent Decree violations resulted in a fine of \$6,000 per violation. Of these 17 operations conducted after 11:00 pm, nine (53%) were delayed due to poor weather conditions, five (29%) were

delayed due to mechanical issues, two (12%) were delayed due to air traffic control-related issues and one (6%) was delayed due to a weight and balance-related issue with an aircraft. In addition, JetBlue conducted a total of 30 operations in between 10:00 pm and 11:00 pm. 26 of these operations qualified as unanticipated delays. Four operations that were conducted in between 10:00 pm and 11:00 pm resulted in fine of \$300 per violation. Of the 30 operations that were conducted in between 10:00 pm and 11:00 pm, two (7%) were conducted within the 5-minute grace period, seven (23%) were delayed due to poor weather conditions, 10 (33%) were delayed due to mechanical issues, four (13%) were delayed due to air traffic control-related issues, three (10%) were delayed due to staffing issues and one (3%) was delayed due to an improperly routed aircraft. JetBlue was fined a total of \$85,200 for the month of April. Thank you to Ryan McMullan, Airport Operation Specialist - Noise Analyst II, for providing this information to our office.

First Quarter Citywide Reported Crime Statistics

Earlier this week, the City Manager's office released the citywide crime statistics for the First Quarter of 2017. In comparison to the First Quarter of 2016, Total Part 1 crime showed a decrease of 8.2 percent. Violent crimes saw a small increase of 0.3 percent, while property crimes was down 9.9 percent. The slight uptick in violent crimes was due to an increase in robberies by 3.8 percent. There were significant double digit decreases in property crime across the board with the greatest decrease being from bike theft 43.8 percent, garage burglaries 23.5 percent, and grand thefts 18.4 percent. Celebrate Cinco De Mayo Responsibly

The Long Beach Police Department's DUI Enforcement Team will deploy this weekend to stop and arrest alcohol and drug-impaired drivers. DUI Saturation Patrols will deploy on Friday, May 5, 2016, between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m., in areas with high frequencies of DUI collisions and/or arrests. Officers will look for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving, which now accounts for a growing number of impaired driving crashes. Bird LA Day at El Dorado Nature Center



The city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. - The City Council will discuss approving a ten-year loan to the Aquarium of the Pacific Corporation from the Tidelands Fund.


Be Kind to Animals Week May 7-13

Looking for a bit of nature in the middle of the city? Nestled between the San Gabriel River and the 605 Freeway, El Dorado Nature Center is an oasis of natural habitat, offering visitors the chance to escape the hustle and bustle of the urban environment.

The 105 acres that make up the Nature Center grounds provide sanctuary for animals and plant life. Two miles of dirt trails and a ¼ mile paved trail wind around two lakes, a stream and forested areas. At the entrance, cross over the wooden bridge that spans the lake and you'll find yourself on a small island that houses the Visitor Center, containing educational displays, art gallery and a small gift shop offering environmentally themed books and gifts.
