Overflow Crowd at Whaley Park General Plan LUE Meeting

On Wednesday night, a huge crowd of over 700 residents attended the second of four General Plan Land Use Element Community Workshops. The Whaley Park Community Center was filled to capacity by 6:00 pm, and an overflow tent was filled shortly thereafter. Director of Development Services, Amy Bodek, promised to stay until all questions were answered. That ended up taking over 4 hours as the meeting, scheduled to end at 8:00 pm, lasted until 10:20 pm.

Community Workshops for General Plan Land Use Element

The City of Long Beach will be conducting new and expanded public outreach for the City of Long Beach General Plan Land Use and Urban Design Element update process. The update to the General Plan is aimed at guiding Long Beach into a more sustainable future over the next 23 years and to meet new state requirements and development principles.

The City is hosting additional citywide community workshops before the Land Use Element is presented to the Planning Commission in a study session for review and comment, and subsequently for recommendations. Once the Planning Commission makes recommendations, the Land Use Element will be presented to the City Council for deliberation and input before adoption.

The City is encouraging residents and property owners to attend an upcoming citywide community workshop:


Preferential Parking Permits Discounted 75%

There are many Preferential Parking Districts (PPD) throughout the Fourth District. Each household in a PPD is allowed up to three residential permits and one guest preferential permit per year. The annual, non-subsidized, fee for each residential preferential permit or guest permit is \$33.00. Permits issued after March of each year are prorated to the number of quarters remaining in the year. The prorated permit fee for October 1st through Dec. 31st is only \$9.00. The city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are a few of the topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's city council meeting:



- The City Council will discuss approving an Alcoholic Beverage Control License for Aspara Cafe on Anaheim St.
- The City Council will consider awarding a contract to Palp., Inc., dba Excel Paving Company for the intersection improvement project of Redondo Avenue and Anaheim Street.
- The City Council will discuss asking Human Service to report back on the feasibility, strategy, and potential benefits to conducting a public health detailing campaign on promoting judicious opioid prescribing among Long Beach doctors and other applicable healthcare staff.

El Dorado Nature Center



Looking for a bit of nature in the middle of the city? Nestled between the San Gabriel River and the 605 Freeway, El Dorado Nature Center is an oasis of natural habitat, offering visitors the chance to escape the hustle and bustle of the urban environment.

The 105 acres that make up the Nature Center grounds provide sanctuary for animals and plant life. Two miles of dirt trails and a ¼ mile paved trail wind around two lakes, a stream and forested areas. At the entrance, cross over the wooden bridge that spans the lake and you'll find yourself on a small island that houses the Visitor Center, containing educational displays, art gallery and a small gift shop offering environmentally themed books and gifts.
