Land Use Element & General Plan Update

As confirmed in last week's GF!F newsletter, the LUE/General Plan is scheduled to come to City Council on March 6th. Community Hospital Update

On Tuesday night, City Council held a "closed session" to discuss Community Hospital. Technically, the CHLB issue is a "real estate transaction", so the meeting was not held in public. I was very pleased with the outcome, and I feel we have a very clear direction moving forward. We also have a date and time for our next "Save the East Side ER" task force meeting. LGB Noise Ordinance Meeting Last Wednesday



CSULB Earl Burn Japanese Garden



Seismic Survey 2018

In our August newsletters, we told you about the upcoming underground mapping survey. Crews placed data recording "nodes" in residential parkways. Small holes about 8 inches in diameter by 11 inches deep are dug and receive a PVC sleeve and green "whiskers" to mark the spot. Nodes, that are completely passive and emit no energy, are then buried to record and store the data. This month, survey trucks will stop at each site for 3 to 5 minutes to transmit the acoustical energy into the ground that is recorded by the node. Redondo Avenue and Anaheim Street Intersection Project

Long Beach Public Works will start construction on a project enhancing the Redondo Avenue and Anaheim Street

intersection. The purpose of the proposed project is to widen the intersection at Redondo Avenue and Anaheim Street to improve the level of service to reduce traffic congestion and enhance multi-modal safety. The work includes:



- Improvements to Redondo Ave. for a distance of approximately 400 feet north, of the intersection with the addition of an exclusive right-turn lane on the southbound approach
- Improvements to Anaheim Street for a distance of approximately 100 feet west of the intersection
- Modification of the traffic signal
- Relocation/reconstruction of bus stops
- The relocation of utilities

The project improves existing traffic deficiencies and addresses projected traffic volume growth by adding capacity to the turning movements. Construction will begin this month and is scheduled to be completed in April 2018.

LBGO Gas Main Replacement

As part of Long Beach Gas & Oil's (LBGO) ongoing maintenance and replacement program, LBGO has contracted with ARB, Inc. to replace large diameter natural gas distribution mains within the City. Due to the nature of the work, portions of the public right-of-way will be restricted. "No Parking" areas will be limited as much as is practical and will be posted 24 hours in advance when possible. All work along Pacific Coast Highway will be performed during overnight hours Monday night through Friday morning. During that time, parking will be restricted during the hours of 8:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. The "night work" is scheduled to begin on Monday 02/05/18. Work along Outer Traffic Circle and Ximeno Avenue will be performed during work hours of 6:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Vehicles parking in the posted areas during work hours will be subject to towing and impound.

Upcoming City Council Agenda

The city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are some of the topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's special city council meeting:

- City Council will discuss a recommendation to increase appropriations in General Fund (GF) in the City Prosecutor Department (CP) by \$18,000, offset by the Fourth Council District one-time infrastructure funds transferred from the Capital Projects Fund (CP) in the Public Works Department (PW) to support the funding of a Neighborhood Impact Prosecutor for a one-year period of time.
- City Council will consider a recommendation to approve the use of the Fourth Council District's one-time infrastructure funds in the Capital Projects Fund (CP) in the Public



Works Department (PW) in the amount of \$19,681 to support the installation of Driver Feedback signs at various locations in the Fourth Council District.

- City Council will discuss a recommendation to receive and file the application of Thairatanakul, Incorporated, dba Bai Plu Thai & Sushi Bar, for an inter-county premise to premise transfer of an Alcoholic Beverage Control License, at 2119 North Bellflower Boulevard.

Googie Architecture and the Space Age

The mid-century modern Googie architectural style is said to have drawn its inspiration from "Space Age ideals and rocket ship

dreams". A great example of this style was the Beachtown Motel sign at the Traffic Circle. As shown in the 1959 photo below, it dominated the landscape as did the cantilevered roof of tiki-themed Java Lanes to the left. The photo also illustrates there were more than just rocket ship "dreams" in 1959. That's an actual Atlas rocket below the sign being trucked from the Convair assembly plant near San Diego to its launching site at Vandenberg AFB. This was six years before the 405 Freeway opened, so the 300 mile route used PCH (Highway 101) through Long Beach and the Traffic Circle.
