Community Hospital Update - WE DID IT AGAIN!

What an incredible council meeting we had on Tuesday night. My council colleagues unanimously supported my motion to begin negotiations with a new hospital operator, Molina, Wu, Network, LLC, and put us on a path to Save Community Hospital! Special thanks to all the supporters who attended including The CHLB Foundation, the CA Nurses Association, Dr. Mario Molina, Dr. Mike Vasilomanolakis and many others. Even more encouraging CHLB news this morning!

City Manager, Pat West, delivered more great news this morning: Over the last 48 hours, the City and MemorialCare have been discussing a collaborative solution for the future operation of Community Hospital that will address City Council priorities discussed at the City Council's June 19 meeting. MemorialCare and the City have a meeting scheduled this afternoon to review terms for the suspension of the hospital license, and a transition plan to allow the new operator access to Community Hospital while the change of ownership

application is considered by the State. While we don't have all the details, we believe a collaborative solution is possible. We have both agreed to refrain from any non-constructive public comments during the period of negotiations. City staff will keep you posted on how the meeting goes this afternoon; this formal dialogue appears to be a positive, concrete breakthrough.

JetBlue Public Hearing Canceled (Permanently)

The on-again, off-again JetBlue public hearing to consider the carrier's appeal of noise violation fines will not be coming to City Council next Tuesday. This item, which is separate from the review of the Noise Ordinance fine structure, was specifically an appeal to City Council related to the Airport Director's decision to uphold fines applied to JetBlue for late night curfew violations. Yesterday at 5:30 pm., we received notice that JetBlue has agreed to withdraw their appeal, and the terms are acceptable to the City and the Airport. Accordingly, the proposed settlement addresses our present concerns but still allows for JetBlue to file appeals in the future if they so choose. The June 26th Special Council Meeting is canceled.

Fireworks are Illegal

With the 4th of July holiday fast approaching, the Long Beach Fire and Police Departments would like to remind residents and visitors that all fireworks, including those marked "Safe and Sane," are ILLEGAL in the City of Long Beach.

The Fire and Police Departments will be out in force the days leading up to and on July 4th to ensure compliance of the Long Beach City Ordinance that bans fireworks. Although both Departments seek voluntary compliance to ensure public safety, this duty often requires strict enforcement of all laws through arrest and citations. Anyone cited or arrested for fireworks violations may be faced with a \$1,000 fine, sentenced to jail for six months, or both. The fines and penalties may increase depending on the fireworks' classification. Fireworks may be voluntarily disposed of at collection bins located at all fire stations or Lifeguard Headquarters (2100 E. Ocean Boulevard, on the West side of the Junipero lot).

And Finally

From Cabart to Community Center

If you've ever wondered about the origins of the United Cambodian Community Center building at Anaheim & Junipero, its architecture has certainly changed over the years. The building opened on October 15, 1936 as the Cabart Theatre, and it closed on November 12, 1961. The Press Telegram coverage of the opening included a story titled "Cabart Theater opening marks new advance of Anaheim Street." The next day edition of the P-T had a story, "Long Beach's new, ultra modern playhouse; throngs greet Cabart Theater dedication." Prior to the opening, the July 12, 1936 edition of the P-T had a titled story "Work is started on movie house costing \$75,000; on southwest corner of Anaheim & Junipero."
