Hot Topics

Land Use Element & General Plan Update

After three hours of public testimony and an additional three hours of Council comment, the Place Type Maps for the Land

Use Element were approved with a 8-1 vote. I was the only council member to vote in opposition of the recommendation. I want to thank nearly 100 people who spoke at the City council meeting and those who communicated their concerns with our office. City staff made additional recommendations to reduce height and density in the Fourth Council District. The new maps will be available sometime next week. I will hold off on my comments until next week's newsletter when we can post the CD4 map. In the meantime, here is a [written description](#) of what was changed from the December Maps at Tuesday's (into Wednesday morning) meeting.



Community Hospital Update

On Monday, MemorialCare confirmed their intentions to not renew their Lease Agreement and gave their 120-day lease termination notice. You can view their letter at this [link](#). MemorialCare also responded to the [City's letter](#) requesting a closure extension, which you can view at this [link](#). Later in the week, we were made aware that MemorialCare has diverted all Advance Life Support patients incoming to CHLB to Long Beach Memorial. This was done without any prior notice to any City Departments. The City released a [statement](#) earlier this morning reaction to the MemorialCare action. Finally we have a couple of task force "save the date" items: Friday, 3/16, late morning and Monday, 3/26, early evening. We'll post times and locations as soon as they are available.




Bob and Nancy Foster Honored by CSULB Dirtbags

LBPD Standoff Leads to City Hall Lockdown

During and after last Wednesday's incident, I received a number inquiries asking if our office was affected. Normally, I wouldn't be at City Hall on a Wednesday afternoon, but I was in the Council Chamber for a special council meeting that started at 4:00 pm. CD4 staffers,

Barbara Moore and Fernando Ochoa, were in our office on the 14th floor. LBPD ordered a lock down of the building, and nobody was allowed to exit City Hall. 

Rainy Day Cart Procedures from Long Beach Recycles

Rain has been in past and is anticipated for future Long Beach weather forecasts. City crews are busy preparing for future storms with a coordinated, multi-department response by clearing catch basins, clean and test pump stations and much more. Make Way for Rain

- Park **6 to 10** in. from the curb to maintain a clear path for rain water.

If your carts are out on a rainy day, place them:

- **3 to 5** ft. from curb, and
- at least **2** ft away from objects and each other

This helps rain water flow to storm drains and prevent carts from floating away.

Next on the Council Agenda: March 13th

The city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the

council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers.



- The City Council will consider a recommendation to receive supporting documentation into the record, conclude the public hearing, and adopt Negative Declaration 10-17; Declaring an ordinance amending various sections of Title 21 of the Long Beach Municipal Code (Zoning), relating to Unattended Donation Boxes read, adopted as read, and laid over to the next regular meeting of the City Council for final reading; and declaring the urgency thereof and declaring this ordinance shall take effect immediately.
- The City Council will discuss a recommendation to receive and file a report on the Long Beach Values Act; and Adopt resolution entitled the "Long Beach Values Act of 2018" regarding procedures for the requesting, collecting, maintaining, and disclosing of sensitive information and the enforcement of federal immigration law.




And Finally
