2-Days-Per-Week Watering Restrictions Begin Next Week

On June 2, 2016, the LB Board of Water Commissions declared a Stage 1 water supply shortage (rescinding the Stage 2) that permitted outdoor watering three days per week. However, the Stage 1 designation also stipulates that watering must revert back to two days per week from October 1st through March 31st. 
- Presentation for the retirement of the Fire Chief Michael Duree
- Council will consider a recommendation to approve the use of the Fourth Council District's one-time infrastructure funds in the Capital Projects Fund (CP) in the Public Works Department (PW) in the amount of \$7,000 to support the sidewalk and driveway improvements at 2625 East 11th Street.
- Council will discuss a recommendation to adopt resolution approving the Annual Report for October 1, 2018 to September 30, 2019, for the East Anaheim Street Parking and Business Improvement Area, declaring its intention to levy the annual assessment, and setting the date of hearing for Tuesday, October 23, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.


