### Fiscal Year 2019 Budget Passed!

Tuesday night's city council meeting lasted until 2:00 am Wednesday morning, but happy to report we got a balanced budget passed. The biggest news for our district is that Engine 17 was restored! Other public safety priorities included a new LBFD HEART team to address homelessness, new police and fire academies, and six new LBPD bike officers. We also identified funding for both youth and senior programming and \$1.2 million for critical watering needs in our parks. Thank you to the CD4 residents who provided input, and thanks to Mayor Garcia and my council colleagues for unanimously supporting the restoration of E17.

## Community Hospital Update

At Tuesday's council meeting (actually Wednesday morning at 2:00 am), we passed agenda item 27: "... to execute all documents necessary, including any as-needed agreements, for interim property maintenance and management of City-owned property, commonly known as Community Hospital, at 1720 Termino Avenue, 1760 Termino Avenue, and 4111 East Wilton Street." This will enable the City to handle any issues prior to the official handoff to the new operator. Also, there will likely not be a September task force meeting. Negotiations between the City and MWN will have progressed to the point where the information cannot be shared publicly prior to a final agreement being signed.

The City Council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Here are some of the topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's city council meeting:



*Note: The FY2019 Budget was passed earlier week, so the first item below has already been completed*

- Recommendation to receive supporting documentation into the record, conclude the public hearing, and take the actions necessary to adopt the Fiscal Year 2019 budget as listed in Attachment A.
- Recommendation to authorize City Manager, or designee, to execute all documents, and any needed subsequent amendments, with Living Cities, a 501(c)(3) non-profit collaborative of 18 foundations and financial institutions focusing on impactful results for low-income people, to accept and expend National Innovation grant funding in an amount not to exceed \$100,000, to foster entrepreneurship and job growth, for the period of September 1, 2018 to August 31, 2019.
- Recommendation to refer to the Housing and Neighborhoods Committee to consider the renaming of the Long Beach Fire Department Regional Training Center

located at 2249 Argonne Avenue, the "Captain David Rosa Regional Training Center."

September 19th




### Built Like a Mack Truck
