Next on the Council Agenda

April 9th | 5 pm | 333 W. Ocean Blvd

The City Council meeting will start at 5 p.m. in the council chamber on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are a few topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's city council meeting:



- The Council will consider a recommendation to adopt Resolution of Intention declaring the intention of the City Council to add new business types to the East Anaheim Street Parking and Business Improvement Area methodology of assessment and, set the date of Tuesday, April 23, 2019, for the public hearing. (Districts 3,4).
- The Council will discuss a recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund (GF) in the Parks, Recreation and Marine Department (PR) in the amount of \$4,490, offset by the Fourth Council District one-time District Priority Funds transferred from the Citywide Activities Department to support the installation of adaptive swings at Stearns Champion Park; and Decrease appropriations in the General Fund (GF) in the Citywide Activities Department (XC) to offset a transfer to the Parks, Recreation and Marine Department.
- The Council will consider a recommendation to adopt a Minute Order declaring a citywide moratorium on accepting applications for new drive-through lanes at any new or existing business establishments; direct City Manager to have the Department of Development Services and the Planning Commission review the development standards for drive-through lanes and make recommendations to the City Council; and, request City Attorney to prepare an interim (moratorium) ordinance pursuant to Chapter 21.50 of the Long Beach Municipal Code for notice and placement on the City Council agenda for hearing at its third meeting following adoption of this Minute Order.
- The Council will discuss a recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund (GF) in the Public Works Department (PW) in the amount of \$13,000, offset by the Fourth Council District one-time District Priority Funds transferred from the General Fund (GF) in the Citywide Activities Department (XC) to support the installation of Driver Feedback Signs on Stearns Street; and Decrease appropriations in the General Fund (GF) in the Citywide Activities Department (XC)

to offset a transfer to the Public Works Department (PW).


And Finally

Two Fires, Including Spires

There were two high-profile fires in CD4 on Wednesday. One was at the El Dorado Nature Center, and the other at the vacant Spires Restaurant. Both were examples of the excellent work by the LBFD to keep damages at a minimum. In the case of Spires, the location at Lakewood and Willow is 0.7 miles from Station 17. However, with no Engine 17, responses by four engine companies (E4, E10, E14 & E19) had to come from much greater distances (see map below). Great work LBFD!
