January 19th | 11:00 am | Barrett Athletic Administration Center



## Rainy Day Trash Container Rules

**Make Way for Rain**

- Park **6 to 10** in. from the curb to maintain a clear path for rain water.

If your carts are out on a rainy day, place them:

- **3 to 5** ft. from curb, and
- at least **2** ft away from objects and each other

This helps rain water flow to storm drains and prevent carts from floating away.



## Los Altos Village and the Atherton Corridor

With CSULB's proposal to build more facilities along the Atherton Corridor, it is interesting to look back at "lower campus" when the neighborhood was first established. The Los Altos Village homes, east of Bellflower Blvd., were built in the early 1950's. By 1956, Los Altos Shopping Center, shown under construction at the lower left in the photo, was opened S/E of Bellflower and Stearns. The open space at the top right of the photo is the Long Beach State College lower campus. You can see that there are no structures along the Atherton Corridor and just a few buildings at Anaheim Rd. and Palo Verde. The LBSC track is in the same spot it is today, but it is surrounded by open land that became gravel parking lots. The huge open lots were used by many Los Altos baby boomers to learn to drive. It would have been impossible to imagine in 1955 that the open space would one day contain three parking structures, the Carpenter Center, a dance center, music center, sports fields, a strip mall, fire station, child care center, recycle center, college dorms and a Pyramid.
