


Hot Topics

JetBlue 2018 Noise Violation Fine Totals

For the first time in five years, the number of JetBlue late night noise violations decreased from the previous year. While it's good to finally see a downward trend (it beats the alternative), the 2018 fine total was nearly a million dollars and a 65% increase over the 2016 total. The 2018 data is preliminary pending final verification of times, noise levels and unanticipated delay status. The total number of Consent Decree violations for JetBlue in 2018 was 175. This resulted in a Consent Decree fine total of \$984,000. We'll have our explanation for the downward trend in next week's newsletter. LGB staff, our City Attorney's office and outside council are continuing the reexamination of our ordinance. Throughout the process, they are fully committed to protecting the Airport Noise Compatibility Ordinance.

Recycle Your Christmas Tree Continues

Now through January 11th, you can drop off your tree for recycling at one of 12 special locations. Your nearest location may be either Stearns Park (corner of 23rd St. and Roycroft) or the CSULB Recycling Center (5800 Atherton). If your trash is collected by the City's refuse and recycling service, you qualify for a FREE pick-up at your home on January 12th. Just make sure you put it out before 7 AM where you normally leave your carts. If your tree is over 12 ft. tall, make sure to cut it in half. Visit the [website](#) for more information.



SCAQMD "No Burn Days" Alerts Continue

During late fall and early winter, the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) asks residents to participate in its "Check Before You Burn" program. On a "no burn day", burning wood as well as manufactured fire logs in fireplaces or any indoor or outdoor wood-burning device is prohibited. Under the program -- intended to help improve wintertime air quality -- SCAQMD may issue mandatory no-burn alerts from November 1 through the end of February. Rainy Day Cart Procedures from Long Beach Recycles

With the National Weather Service predicting rain, we thought we would post the rainy day cart procedures and other rain related information. To report street flooding, downed trees or inquire about street sweeping, please call 562-570-2700. Make Way for Rain

- Park **6 to 10** in. from the curb to maintain a clear path for rain water.

If your carts are out on a rainy day, place them:

- **3 to 5** ft. from curb, and
- at least **2** ft away from objects and each other

This helps rain water flow to storm drains and prevent carts from floating away.




Next on the Council Agenda January 8th | 5 pm | 333 W. Ocean

The City Council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online [here](#) and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are some agenda topics for Tuesday's city council meeting:

- The City Council will discuss a recommendation to approve the destruction of records for the Legislative Department.
- The City Council will consider a recommendation to declare ordinance amending the Long Beach Municipal Code by adding Chapter 1.15, and by repealing Sections 2.01.210(b) and 2.01.1010; all relating to changing the regular election dates of the Primary Nominating and General Municipal Elections to March and November, respectively, to coincide with statewide elections as required by SB 415, read and adopted as read.

Everyone Counts! Volunteers Needed
