

## And Finally

### 11th Street & Obispo Avenue Eighty Years Ago

We are often asked where we get the vintage photos and ads that appear in our weekly newsletter. The answer is they come from a variety of sources including photo archives, newspaper archives, yearbooks and articles of clothing. That's right, the Fire Station 22 mascot we featured last week came from the back of a T-shirt. The eighty-year-old photo/ad below came from the 1939 Long Beach City College "Saga" yearbook. The building in the shot was immediately recognizable, but the address of 1011 Obispo did not fit. That would be the northwest corner of 10th and Obispo where Long Beach Pride is now located. It's obvious the photo was taken at the northwest corner of 11th and Obispo because the building is still standing. The current photo of the location clearly shows the address as 1101 Obispo. The only thing we can figure is that it was simply a typo in the 1939 LBCC yearbook.


