## COVID-19 Updates

### Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

#### By the Numbers (Long Beach only | As of 4/23/2020):

- 518 positive results, including 43 people who are hospitalized and approximately 297\* cases where people have recovered.
  - 155 positive cases have been confirmed at a total of seven [long-term care facilities](#) in Long Beach, which includes sites with active cases, cleared cases and fatalities. These cases include both facility residents and staff members (who may not be Long Beach residents).
- There is a total of 27 fatalities:
  - All had underlying health conditions
  - 22 are associated with long-term care facilities
  - Three individuals were in their 50s, five were in their 60s, three were in their 70s and 16 were over 80 years old
  - 11 individuals were men and 16 were women



- At this time, to avoid risk to patient privacy, no further details will be provided

\*Please note that, for low-risk patients recovering at home, recovery data is self-reported. The City will update this number to the best of its ability, but can only provide an approximate total.

### Tracking the Curve:

- Yesterday's information regarding positive cases, hospitalizations, and demographic breakdown is available online at [www.longbeach.gov/COVID19](http://www.longbeach.gov/COVID19) and in the City's data dashboard (attached), providing the most up-to-date information available.

The increase in case/per 100K is due to the increase in cases and an update on the data set using the most currently available census data.


### Safer at Home Order:

CalFresh EBT to Include Amazon and Walmart Groceries Online

As of April 28, 2020 you can use your EBT card to make purchases online. Individuals and families can purchase groceries online using their EBT card at Amazon and Walmart. If you receive CalWORKs, you may also be able to use your cash benefits to make purchases online at Wal-Mart. CalFresh provides monthly food benefits that help individuals and families buy healthy, nutritious food! Even if temporary, individuals and families who have experienced a change in their circumstances and need additional help may apply for CalFresh. 



### "Your Name Here" at Palo Verde and the 405

Yesterday, a work crew repaired the iconic pole sign at the corner of Palo Verde and Woodruff next to the 405 Freeway. It was damaged in a wind storm a few years ago and has remained blank ever since. The huge 24 ft. by 5 ft. sign was upgraded with LED lighting and now has "Your Name Here" posted on both sides. It can easily be seen from the northbound 405 Freeway as shown in the Caltrans camera image below. If we ever decided to open a field office at that location, our Go Fourth! logo would look mighty impressive on the sign. Longtime Los Altos residents may remember the original tenant at 2211 Palo Verde Ave. It was one of the 50 Carpeteria stores throughout Southern California. That name appeared on the sign for many years.
