COVID-19 Updates

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

By the Numbers (Long Beach only | as of 4/30/2020):

- 667 total positive results
- 36 fatalities
- 58 people hospitalized
- Approximately 402 recovered (Please note that, for low-risk patients recovering at home, recovery data is self-reported.)

Details Regarding Fatalities:

- All had underlying health conditions
- 30 are associated with long-term care facilities
- Three individuals were in their 50s, seven were in their 60s, three were in their 70s and 23 were over 80 years old
- 17 individuals were men and 19 were women
- At this time, to avoid risk to patient privacy, no further details will be provided



Long-Term Care Facility Case Information:

- 201 positive cases have been confirmed at a total of 17 long-term care facilities in the city, since the beginning of the pandemic (17 is a cumulative number; the Long Beach Health and Human Services Department is currently monitoring 12 long-term care facilities with active cases). These cases include both facility residents and staff members (who may not be Long Beach residents).
- In line with the California Department of Public Health's standard for [listing skilled nursing facilities](#) with positive cases, the City is listing facilities currently experiencing outbreaks (of over 2 cases of COVID-19) including counts for health care workers and residents (see attached).

Tracking the Curve:

- Yesterday's information regarding positive cases, hospitalizations, and demographic breakdown is available online at longbeach.gov/COVID19 and in the City's data dashboard (attached), providing the most up-to-date information available.
- A person experiencing homelessness who tested positive for COVID-19 visited the City's Winter Shelter in West Long Beach last week. The individual, an adult male, exhibited symptoms of COVID-19 during the shelter's intake procedures and was subsequently transported to a Los Angeles County hospital where he was tested and is currently recovering in stable condition. All individuals who had direct exposure to the individual are being tested as a precaution. This case is included in Los Angeles County statistics, not Long Beach.

Testing for Long Beach Residents:

- Diagnostic testing in Long Beach is available for anyone with symptoms of COVID-19. Certain locations are also testing essential workers who may have been exposed but are not showing symptoms. Same or next day appointments can be made online and are prioritized for those 65 years or older; individuals with underlying chronic health conditions; and first responders, critical government workers, grocery workers, and health care professionals. ReopenLB Online Survey



The City of Long Beach launched an online survey, [ReopenLB](#), to seek input from residents, workers and business owners about how to safely reopen the local economy once Governor Newsom's order indicates it is safe to do so. Survey questions ask respondents if they feel safe to return to work or to reopen their businesses, and about what they consider to be low-risk activities. 

As of April 28, 2020 you can use your EBT card to make purchases online. Individuals and families can purchase groceries online using their EBT card at Amazon and Walmart. If you receive CalWORKs, you may also be able to use your cash benefits to make purchases online at Wal-Mart. CalFresh provides monthly food benefits that help individuals and families buy healthy, nutritious food! Even if temporary, individuals and families who have experienced a change in their circumstances and need additional help may apply for CalFresh. Californians can visit GetCalFresh.org to apply or call 877-847-3663 (FOOD) to be connected to their local county social service office.

Cinco de Mayo & Cinco de Modica

This year, we won't be in the Council Chamber for Cinco de Mayo, but we will hold a council meeting via teleconference. Prior to the 5 pm meeting, we will hold a special closed session from 3:30 to 4:30 pm. The purpose of the closed session is to discuss goals and expectations with our new City Manager, Tom Modica. It's a very important and somewhat rare event to hire a new City Manager. The last time it happened was a dozen years ago. The official title of the closed session will be agendized this afternoon as: "Pursuant to paragraph (b)(1) of Section 54957 of the California Government Code regarding Public Employee Performance Evaluation: City
