HAPPENING NOW!

LB Flyover by USAF Thunderbirds Begins at 1:35 pm

The Air Force Thunderbirds will pass over Long Beach between the approximate times of 1:35 and 2 pm today as part of a nationwide tribute to healthcare workers and first responders during the COVID-19 pandemic. The squadron will approach Long Beach from the NW and exit to the coastline traveling SE (see map below). Residents in these areas will be able to see the flyover from the safety of their home-quarantine and should maintain all social distancing guidelines during this event. They should also refrain from traveling to landmarks, hospitals and gathering in large groups to view the flyover.





COVID-19 Updates

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

By the Numbers (Long Beach only | As of 5/14/2020):

- 1,157 total positive results
 - The increase in reported positive cases today was caused by a delay in reporting results from a private lab that had been contracted by Los Angeles County.
 - These lab results date back as far as April 1.
 - These results were from Los Angeles County testing sites where Long Beach residents had been tested.
 - A Long Beach Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine employee has tested positive for COVID-19. The employee works in the Marine Bureau in a public-facing area. Their most recent day at the work site was May 1. The employee is recovering at home in self-isolation. The employee is not a Long Beach resident and, thus, not included in the total case count for the city.
 - The City is only publicly reporting the case numbers associated with Long Beach first responders and employees who are on the frontlines of this pandemic who have daily, significant interactions with community members. Cases involving other City employees will not be publicly reported.
- 51 fatalities
- 54 people hospitalized
- Approximately 730 recovered (Please note that, for low-risk patients recovering at home, recovery data is self-reported.)
- Data snapshot is as of 12:01 a.m. today.



Details Regarding Fatalities:

- 40 are associated with long-term care facilities
- One individual in their 40s, three individuals were in their 50s, 10 were in their 60s, eight were in their 70s and 29 were over 80 years old
- 28 individuals were men and 23 were women
- One person's death is currently under investigation; the other individuals all had underlying health conditions
- At this time, to avoid risk to patient privacy, no further details will be provided

Long-Term Care Facility Case Information:

- 333 positive cases have been confirmed at a total of 22 long-term care facilities in the city since the start of the pandemic (22 is a cumulative number; the Health Department is currently monitoring long-term care facilities with active cases). These cases include both facility residents and staff members (who may not be residents). Long Beach has a total of 93 long-term care facilities.
- In line with the California Department of Public Health's standard for [listing skilled nursing facilities](#) with positive cases, the City is listing facilities currently experiencing outbreaks (more than two cases of COVID-19) including counts for health care workers and residents (see attachment).

Testing for Long Beach Residents:

- Diagnostic testing in Long Beach is available for anyone with symptoms of COVID-19. Certain locations are also testing essential workers who may have been exposed but are not showing symptoms. Same or next day appointments can be made online and are prioritized for those 65 years or older; individuals with underlying chronic health conditions; and first responders, critical government workers, grocery workers, and health care professionals. 

LB Reopens Beaches for Active Recreation & Low-Risk Businesses

In an [amendment](#) to the City of Long Beach's Safer at Home Order, the City reopened all public beaches in Long Beach for active recreational activities on Wednesday, May 13, until further notice. Beaches will open daily from sunrise to sunset for solo or family members of the same household to use for recreation. Beach restrooms are open, adhering to physical distancing protocols. As a precautionary measure, staff is

disinfecting facilities on a regular basis to deter the spread of the virus. Rosie's Dog Beach reopened, and to remain consistent throughout the city and with Los Angeles County, the City's dog parks reopened as well.



In addition to the reopening of the beach and dog parks, the following businesses may now operate with limitations under the most recent [amended Health Order](#): self-service carwashes, with restrictions; businesses providing services for animal such as grooming, walking and training, with restrictions; outdoor museums may open for the purpose of outdoor recreational activities only. Physical distancing protocols must be adhered to.

Grocery Stores in the Fourth District

All stores have expressed that they are getting regular shipments of food, and that they are restocking their shelves each day. However, some stores are restricting entry to prohibit overcrowding, which may lead to longer wait times outside the store. Special operating hours for adults 65+ & people with disabilities are indicated below in **red**.

Street Sweeping Parking Enforcement Update

The Long Beach City Council extended the temporary suspension of street sweeping citations from May 4th to May 17th. City staff will now only issue warning notices on vehicles beginning May 4th, and citation enforcement will begin on May 18th. That is the Monday following the end of the "Safer at Home" order. 

Long Beach Honors Dr. Thomas Clark

On Tuesday, flags on City buildings were flown at half staff in recognition of the passing of Dr. Tom Clark. Tuesday evening, the city council meeting was adjourned in memory of our former 4th District Councilman, Mayor and City College Trustee. We've been asked about the naming of a City asset in Dr. Clark's honor. That process is governed by a section of the City's Administrative Regulations which reads: "The naming of City-owned land, buildings, and facilities in honor of deceased persons shall generally not take place until one year after their deaths, unless the City Council determines that there are overriding considerations for deviating from this policy guideline." Fortunately, Tom Clark shared his thoughts on the subject with me back in 2016. I'll be bringing that proposal forward to City Council on May 11, 2021.


Tom Clark was the consummate public servant. After military service, he attended Long Beach City College and excelled in academics and Track and Field. He earned his BS, OD and MS degrees at UC Berkeley then opened his optometry practice in Los Altos in 1953. In 1966, he was elected to the Long Beach City Council, Fourth District, where he served for 30 years including three terms as Mayor.

After City Council, he was elected to the Long Beach City College Board of Trustees where he served for 16 years. In 1976, he was inducted into the LBCC of Hall of Fame for community leadership. In 2007, he was elected to the LBCC Hall of Champions for Track and Field.

No one in Long Beach history has given more for a longer period of time than the Honorable Tom Clark.

Next on the Council Agenda

May 19th | 5 pm | Teleconference



The City Council teleconference will start at 5 pm. The civic chambers will be closed, but the public can use eComment to provide comments on agenda items. Comments can also be submitted by email to: CityClerk@longbeach.gov. Here are a few items that will be under consideration:

- Recommendation to hold a study session to receive and file a presentation on the City's Fiscal Outlook.
- Recommendation to direct City Manager to create an open streets initiative and explore ways to open more public space throughout Long Beach to allow for increased outdoor activities, safer access to public transit, and stronger economic recovery, all while maintaining appropriate social and physical distancing.
- Recommendation to direct City Attorney to prepare an urgency ordinance amending Long Beach's COVID Eviction Moratorium (LBMC 8.100) and The Housing Authority of the City of Long Beach Moratorium on Section 8 terminations in the following three ways, to align Long Beach's COVID tenant protections with the County and City of Los Angeles: (1) extend the moratorium date from May 31, 2020 until August 31, 2020; (2) extend the amount of time to repay rent from six months to twelve months; and (3) add provisions to address tenant harassment; and direct City Attorney to bring this urgency ordinance back, with these revisions, to the Council for consideration at a special meeting on or before May 26, 2020.
