## COVID-19 Updates

### Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

#### By the Numbers (Long Beach only as of 5/7/2020 ):

- 875 total positive results
  - The increase in positive case numbers today is due to a delay and ultimately an influx of test results submitted from a private lab. The increase reflects data from this lab through May 1. The delayed results may also be a contributing factor for the very low results (2 cases) from May 6.
- 38 fatalities
- 46 people hospitalized
- Approximately 535 recovered (Please note that, for low-risk patients recovering at home, recovery data is self-reported.)
- Data snapshot at 12:01 a.m. today



#### Details Regarding Fatalities:

- All had underlying health conditions

- 31 are associated with long-term care facilities
- Three individuals were in their 50s, seven were in their 60s, four were in their 70s and 24 were over 80 years old
- 19 individuals were men and 19 were women
- At this time, to avoid risk to patient privacy, no further details will be provided

**Long-Term Care Facility Case Information:**

- 252 positive cases have been confirmed at a total of 21 long-term care facilities in the city since the start of the pandemic (21 is a cumulative number; the Health Department is currently monitoring long-term care facilities with active cases). These cases include both facility residents and staff members (who may not be residents). Long Beach has a total of 93 long-term care facilities.
- In line with the California Department of Public Health's standard for [listing skilled nursing facilities](#) with positive cases, the City is listing facilities currently experiencing outbreaks (more than two cases of COVID-19) including counts for health care workers and residents (see attachment).

**Tracking the Curve:**

- Yesterday's information regarding positive cases, hospitalizations, and demographic breakdown is available online at [longbeach.gov/COVID19](http://longbeach.gov/COVID19) and in the City's data dashboard (attached), providing the most up-to-date information available.

**Testing for Long Beach Residents:**

- Diagnostic testing in Long Beach is available for anyone with symptoms of COVID-19. Certain locations are also testing essential workers who may have been exposed but are not showing symptoms. Same or next day appointments can be made online and are prioritized for those 65 years or older; individuals with underlying chronic health conditions; and first responders, critical government workers, grocery workers, and health care professionals. ## Reopening with Restrictions Starting TODAY

Effective today, May 8th, the City of Long Beach will allow retail businesses, with modified operations and proper sanitizing and physical distancing protocols in place, to reopen for curbside pickup and delivery services only. This comes after the City's first reopening [announcement](#) and is being done in an effort to align with the reopening direction set forth by Governor Gavin Newsom. In addition, trails and their associated parking lots will reopen, golf courses may open, and car dealership showrooms may open, pending adherence to the City's recommendations and safety protocols.

## Past Events

### Presentation on the City Response to COVID-19

On Tuesday, the City Council received a comprehensive report on the City's response to the novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic. Council provided input and policy direction to staff on next-step strategies for the City's emergency response to COVID-19. One of the policy options I opposed was deferring summer Fire & Police academies (slide 63 of the presentation). ### Long Beach Mourns the Passing of Dr. Tom Clark

On Wednesday, we learned that Mayor Tom Clark had died at the age of 93. Dr. Clark served as the 4th district councilman for 30 years, and that included three terms as Mayor of Long Beach. Editor Emeritus of the Press Telegram, Rich Archbold, asked me about our 2016 recognition ceremony for the obituary he was writing. Below is an excerpt from the obituary:

*"Tributes to Clark poured in from across the city when news spread of his death. When Daryl Supernaw was elected to the City Council in 2015 in the Fourth District, the same district served by Clark for so many years, Supernaw said he wanted to do something to recognize Clark's "incredible contributions to our community." In a dedication*

ceremony on Feb. 6, 2016, a plaque was erected at the southeast corner of Bellflower Boulevard and Stearns Street at the Los Altos Shopping Center. The last line of the inscription states simply, "No one in Long Beach history has given more for a longer period of time than the Honorable Tom Clark." Supernaw said he believed that was the best description of Clark's legacy."

**Dr. Thomas Clark**

Tom Clark was the consummate public servant. After military service, he attended Long Beach City College and excelled in academics and Track and Field. He earned his BS, OD and MS degrees at UC Berkeley then opened his optometry practice in Los Altos in 1953. In 1966, he was elected to the Long Beach City Council, Fourth District, where he served for 30 years including three terms as Mayor.

After City Council, he was elected to the Long Beach City College Board of Trustees where he served for 16 years. In 1976, he was inducted into the LBCC Hall of Fame for community leadership. In 2007, he was elected to the LBCC Hall of Champions for Track and Field.

No one in Long Beach history has given more for a longer period of time than the Honorable Tom Clark.

### Honoring Dr. Thomas Clark

With the passing of Mayor Tom Clark on Wednesday, it is very gratifying to know that we took the time to celebrate his legacy. On February 6, 2016, the 50th anniversary year of his first election, we gathered to honor Long Beach's longest serving elected official. We followed up with a special city council presentation where we showed the video below (click on the arrow) and handed out Clark bars. The Clark candy bar was the signature item Tom Clark used while campaigning. On a personal note, Dr. Clark's legacy is measured in decades by the Supernaw Family. As Mayor, he signed my dad's "Letter of Commendation" from the Long Beach Fire Department in 1975. Forty years later, he signed on to endorse my candidacy for City Council in 2015. Thank you, Tom Clark, for your support and for your unmatched service to our community.
