Long Beach Business Owner:

Your Business in our city is very important to us, and the City of Long Beach appreciates the opportunity to serve you. The proper handling of hazardous materials is a serious concern to this community. A method in which your business and community can be protected is the prompt and thorough completion of the Hazardous Materials Business Emergency Plan packet. Proper handling of hazardous materials is a high priority of the Long Beach Fire Prevention Bureau, Long Beach Health Department, and Long Beach Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Team.

Federal, State, and City Laws require all businesses using chemicals meeting the attached criteria to complete a Hazardous Materials Business Emergency Plan (HMBEP). These laws are the result of serious spills, leaks and fires involving chemicals, which have endangered life and property and have polluted the environment.

The HMBEP requires basic information to be submitted to the Long Beach Fire Department. This shall include specific business information, inventory of all chemicals and detailed diagrams of the business. The HMBEP shall also be readily available at the facility in the event of an emergency or for inspections conducted by the Long Beach Fire Department. Please complete the disclosure forms online in accordance with the instruction sheets, and submit forms to the Long Beach Fire CUPA within 30 days. Your cooperation and prompt response to this matter is greatly appreciated. To get your HMBEP filing started, you will need a Username and Password. To do this, complete the Log-in Request. You will receive a Username and Password via e-mail within 3 business days. Once you have your Username and Password, you will be allowed access to the CUPA's online filing system so that you may complete your HMBEP.
