1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project.

Using best practices (e.g. Housing First, Harm Reduction) & participating in the Long Beach Coordinated Entry System (LB CES), LSSSC will provide 16 households in LB who meets the HUD's DedicatedPlus definition-w/scattered-site TBRA.

LSSSC will identify eligible households through street outreach & current day services programs. All clients will be referred through the LB CES. The LSSSC case manager will assist eligible households to locate & obtain housing. LSSSC will hold leases w/ the landlord.

When housed, LSSSC will assist households to increase income through employment, training programs & mainstream entitlement benefits to help stabilize the household financial status. When necessary, LSSSC will advocate with landlords on behalf of clients to assist them w/overcoming barriers such as poor credit, eviction history or criminal record. The LSSSC case manager will assist participants & their families w/ a client-centered approach to provide assistance & supportive services to each household's needs.

The case manager will assess clients for mental health issues & substance use disorder using SAMHSA-approved screening tools – CAGE-AID & MHSF-III.

The case manager will refer clients with mental health & substance use issues to appropriate health providers.

I

The name of the corporation is:

A. This corporation is a religious corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Non-Profit Religious Corporation Law exclusively for religious purposes. It is irrevocably dedicated to religious, charitable, scientific or educational purposes meeting the requirements for exemption provided by Section 214 of the Revenue and Taxation Code. It is organized to give concrete expression to the concern of the Church for those with limited options, especially the poor and oppressed, through direct social services delivery and through the facilitation of social service/ministry efforts within, through and among constituent Church expressions and in cooperation with other community service providers.

III

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles to the contrary, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation, and the corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (1) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue code of 1986, as amended; or (2) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code.

B. This corporation shall not carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation to such an extent as would result in the loss of exemption under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. This corporation shall not participate in nor intervene in (including publications for distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for political office.

IV

This corporation elects to be governed by all the provisions of the Non-Profit Corporation Law of 1980 not otherwise applicable to it under Part 5 thereof.

V

A. B. On the winding up and dissolution of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts, obligations and liabilities of the corporation, the remaining assets of this corporation shall be distributed in proportion to confirmed membership of:

1. The Pacific Southwest District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod
2. The Southern California (West) Synod of The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America
3. The Pacifica Synod of The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

In the event that such organizations are not organized and operated exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific or educational purposes and have not established their tax-exempt status under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the remaining assets shall be distributed to a social ministry organization which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific or educational purposes meeting the requirements for exemption provided by Section 214 of the Revenue and Taxation Code and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, which qualifies as a distributee under the provisions of this Article and is named by the Board of Directors at a time of dissolution.


