Mandatory Teambuilding Sessions: Team members will discuss group strengths and establish group norms. One mandatory team-building session is required per team. **All project team members have to be present at their team's session.** One project team will be scheduled per session during the weeks of April 13, 2020, through April 24, 2020.

Community Assessment Meetings:

Program participants will be placed in teams that will survey a specific corridor in Long Beach. The team will present its findings at the Thursday, May 7, 2020, meeting. Please allow a total of **at least 10 hours** to meet outside of program sessions to work on the team's community assessment.

Community Project Meetings:

Program participants will additionally be placed in teams to complete a community project in a specific corridor in Long Beach. The team must have its project completed before graduation. Please allow a total of **at least 20 hours** outside of program sessions to work on the team's community project.
