## What is the Neighborhood Leadership Program?

The Neighborhood Leadership Program is offered by the City of Long Beach Housing and Neighborhood Services Bureau. This five-month, multilingual program assists grassroots residents and provides them with the skills, knowledge and resources they need to make a difference in the quality of life of our community.

This program is free to participants and is partially funded through the Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program.

## What is the Time Commitment?

The time commitment for the Neighborhood Leadership Program is intensive. Training sessions are held twice a month for five months and include a weekend retreat and another full Saturday session.
