1. Please confirm that the entirety of the Project Site (see attached Figure 2, *Local Vicinity*) is served by the Long Beach Police Department (LBPD). Please use the following table to indicate which police station(s) serve the Project Site and the existing staffing of those stations.

West Substation	1835 Santa Fe Ave Long Beach, CA	24/7 operation with minimal on-site staffing. Officers deploy to Beats in the West Division area

2. What is the LBPD's performance standard for responding to emergency and non-emergency calls within its service area (i.e., minutes to reach the call location)?

LBPD strives to respond to Priority One Calls for Service (crime in progress/life threatening situation) in, on average, less than 5 minutes. Non-emergency calls are classified as Priority Two, for crimes that have been committed with possible evidence available. The goal is to respond to Priority Two calls for service in 20 minutes, or less, on average. Priority Three calls are generally related to crimes with no evidence potential, but are required/desired to take a report of the crime. The goal is to respond to Priority Three calls for service in 30 minutes, or less, on average.

3. What is the current average response time (in minutes) for emergency and non-emergency calls in the City?

The current average response time to Priority One emergency calls is 4.8 minutes. The current average response time to Priority Two non-emergency calls is 22.2 minutes. The current average response time to Priority Three non-emergency calls is 30.9 minutes.

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4. Are existing resources (personnel, equipment, and facilities) adequate to serve the City and the Project Site under current conditions?

Compared to existing conditions, buildout of the Proposed Project would result in an additional 4,179 total residents, 1,736 dwelling units and approximately 375,000 square feet of nonresidential space (commercial and employment uses) in the Project Site. Please summarize any additional resources (stations, equipment, personnel) needed to serve this future development under the Proposed Project.

None, at this time. While there are currently 1.7 sworn budgeted positions per thousand residents, there is no indication that the proposed additional residents would be new to the City. If the workload resulting from the development exceeds the capacity of the existing workforce, additional staff will be requested.
