Long Beach Grand Prix-Road Closures and Race Information

It's noise, excitement, racing in the streets, and fun (depending on your point of view), Some downtown boaters prefer to leave town, while others enjoy all the festivities. No matter which group you fall into, you will be impacted.

Street closure one: Grand Prix Press Day, March 28th. This day allows members of the press to ride the track. Shoreline Drive will be closed from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The entrance to the marina will be from eastbound Ocean Blvd., to Shoreline Drive, right on Shoreline Drive, through the Alamitos Lot, then across the sand road into the marina itself. The track opens occasionally during the day but the best bet into and out of the marina is via the sand.

Street closure two: Drift March 31st – April 1st. These dates are set aside to exhibit the latest high-speed craze, Drifting. On these two dates, the street closure on Shoreline Drive will be from Ocean Blvd., to Linden Avenue and therefore, the only way into and out of the marina will be via Pine Avenue to Shoreline Drive to Shoreline Village Drive. Street closure three: Wednesday, April 5th and Thursday, April 6th. Access to the Shoreline Marina will be from Pine Avenue to Shoreline Drive to Shoreline Village Drive. Access out of the marina will be via the sand.

Street closure four: Grand Prix race weekend, April 7th – 9th. Between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., the only access to the marina will be via the sand road (just like Press Day). After 7:00 p.m. through 6:00 a.m., entrance to the marina and Shoreline Village will be via Pine Avenue to Shoreline Drive to Shoreline Village Drive. All traffic will egress the marina via the sand

During race weekend, no vendors or maintenance workers will be allowed into the marina. The most important thing for boaters to remember is the parking situation.

NO GUEST PASSES of any kind will be issued. Only Long Beach Shoreline Marina parking passes, with the "17" decal, will be honored during the event. If you have friends coming to visit, you need to make plans to bring them into the marina with you or they must walk down. Shoreline Village will be closed from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. to anyone without Grand Prix tickets.

Parking is difficult at best and very impacted during this event, so, the best suggestion is to plan ahead. We appreciate everyone's cooperation during this time. If you have any questions or concerns, you may contact Kimarie Vestre at (562) 570-3236.

The curriculum covers everything from basic maritime rules of the road, to the OUPV/6-Pack and Upper Tonnage Captain's License (Master 100, 200, 500 & 1600 GT and 3rd Mate). Where Have You Been? *16,116 NM and Counting*



Ted and Joan Palango have been aboard their boat Panchita since heading out from Los Alamitos in 2007.

Ted and Joan Palango of the Seal Beach Yacht Club have completed the Great America Loop in their boat Panchita!! The couple left Alamitos Bay in December 2007 and traveled 16,116 NM through the Panama Canal and the Caribbean before starting the Loop on Feb 7, 2013. On Feb 13, 2017 after 275 stops, 24 US states, 3 Canadian provinces, 137 locks and 8044 nautical miles (9256 statute miles) they crossed their wake in Pelican Bay on Cayo Costa, Florida!! In April they will ship their boat from Ft. Lauderdale back to California and return to Alamitos Bay and cruising southern California waters.

Storm Check: *Don't Let This Happen To You!*

With the increase in rain it is very important that you confirm your mooring lines are all securely tied, that tenders are also secured and covered (if possible), and any property that could blow away is stowed properly. Following the storm, we also recommend that boaters check on the condition of their vessels and tenders. As evident in this photo it is important to address your tender the same as your vessel.

Rules and Regulations Reminder: Partnerships

As a reminder, if you have a partner in your vessel it is important that you complete the necessary paperwork. Below are the marina Rules and Regulations, as they pertain to partnership. If you have any questions, please stop by the marina office and ask one of our friendly and knowledgeable staff members for clarification.

G. Partnership/Corporations:

No permit will be issued in the name of a partnership (general or limited), corporation, joint venture or other legal entity. A slip permit for a vessel which is registered, documented or owned by a partnership (general or limited), corporation, joint venture or other legal entity will be issued only to a natural person whose name appears on the marina waiting list and whose interest in the vessel (whether by virtue of an interest in the partnership, ownership of stock of a corporation or otherwise) is equal to or greater than that of each of the other partners, stockholders, members or associates.

An applicant for a slip permit at a Long Beach marina for a vessel which is owned by a partnership (general or limited), a corporation, joint venture, or other legal entity shall submit for approval by the Manager, a fully executed Marine Bureau Statement of Ownership.

Any gift, sale, assignment or transfer of (i) the applicant's interest in the vessel (ii) his or her interest in the partnership, corporation or other legal entity by which the named Permittee transfers or attempts to transfer the right to use the assigned slip to another person or persons, (including remaining partners and/or stockholders) or to another partnership, corporation or other legal entity shall be void and shall constitute grounds for cancellation of the permit. The only exception to this rule relates to partnerships. When a partnership applies for a permit, one partner must be designated as the Permittee for legal purposes.

Upon execution of the permit, a list of partners will be incorporated with the permit. Under this exception, the permit

may be transferred to any of the original partners, if requested by the existing Permittee, and with appropriate notification and permit changes through the Marine Bureau. The remaining original partner(s) may enter into new partnerships, but the seniority relating to the existing slip will only vest with the original partners. If there are no initial partners, the permit will become void.

Existing partnerships will not be grandfathered, and must contact Marine Bureau to incorporate a partnership list for purposes of this exception, and rights to the slip will revert back to effective date of the adoption of this rule or the incorporation of the partnership list, whichever is later. Notwithstanding the form of ownership of the vessel, the permit to berth the same at a Long Beach marina shall not be transferable under any circumstances, except as allowed herein.

If a Permittee fails or refuses to notify the Manager of a change to any of the information contained in the Marine Bureau Statement of Ownership within five (5) days from the date of any such change, such failure or refusal shall also constitute grounds for cancellation of the permit.
