Marina Vista Sport Court Opens



An opening ceremony for the new Marina Vista Sports Court located at 5355 Eliot Street, was held on March 18, 2017.

Local residents joined Mayor Robert Garcia, Councilmember Suzie Price, Parks, Recreation and Marine Director Marie Knight, Public Works Director Craig Beck, and members of the Johnson family of Long Beach who were involved in the Court's development. The sports court was a result of input from local youth during the Third Council District Youth Participatory Budget process. Ten students were involved in gathering public input and the sports court was selected as a preferred project among the over 700 youth who voted.

"The sport court was an effort by the youth in our community

to come up with a park improvement project," said Councilwoman Suzie Price. Most significantly, however, for me, is the participation of Luke Johnson. Luke was my neighbor and died at the very early age of 16. Luke was diagnosed with Leukemia and was able to participate in this committee for a brief time when he was not in treatment. We are privileged to open this court in his honor."

The sports court was installed between the existing walking path and tennis courts in the central area of Marina Vista Park, in a passive area not regularly used or programmed.

Designed for younger children, the sports court has a 1,200 square foot surface that includes a ten-foot basketball pole with a backboard and hoop, and a four square overlay painted on the court surface. The court material was specifically selected



to be softer and quieter than blacktop to minimize noise impacts. The project was funded from \$110,000 of non-recurring funds from Council District Three.

El Dorado Nature Center Among 20 Best Parks in LA

An exciting new program to support Parks, Recreation and Marine, the “Partnerships to Enhance Parks, Programs and Services” (PEPPS) program was approved by the Long Beach City Council at its March 21 meeting.

PEPPS is designed to engage individuals, businesses and organizations in various sponsorships, donation opportunities and volunteer projects that will not only improve PRM facilities, programs and services, but position the involved entity in a positive way in the community. PEPPS will help to bridge the gap between resources and the need for improved parks, and more programs and services.

A process in place identifying and managing partnerships has been underway since the first Citywide Policy on Sponsorships for Citywide agreements was created in 1996. An update to this policy in 2012 allowed for competitive proposals, donations and program and service sponsorships. In 2016, the City Council requested the development of a new program to include Public/Private Partnerships benefiting programs, facilities and services.

After considerable research that included investigating the best partnership practices from other large cities, PEPPS was created and is a streamlined process that consoli-

dates the City Sponsorship policy, PRM Fee Waiver policy and Right of Entry Permits, and agreements for facility use and the provision of programs and services into one process.

A set of Guiding Principles will determine the selection of sponsors. Among the principals, meeting community need, having a positive social, financial, cultural, environmental impact; and enhancing the City brand and image were identified. Successful PEPPS applicants will also need to show a track record of success, demonstrate financial capacity and ensure that their program or service will be inclusive and free of participation barriers.

Through PEPPS, interested partners can see how to make donations, obtain sponsorships to deliver a program or service, volunteer for park or beach maintenance projects, and how revenue sharing, facility/amenity naming and commercial concessions can work.

LBPRM is reaching out to over 100 current partners and hopes to make it easier for new partners to get involved in making Long Beach a great place to live, work and play.



Rosies' Dog Beach Voted Number One Dog Beach in the Country



People.com compiled input from travelers and locals to find the best dog-friendly beaches in the country and determined that Rosie's Dog Beach is the best dog beach in the country, saying "This Long Beach, California, site has designated dog hours where canines can enjoy cavorting in the sand and surf together."

Rosie's Dog Beach, the only dog beach in Los Angeles

County was also named "Best Dog Park in Los Angeles" in 2016 by L.A.Curbed.com, a popular local real estate blog.

Justin Rudd, a dog enthusiast and community activist hosted a one-day special event called "Haute Dogs on the Beach," in 2001 in which dogs were allowed to run leash-free in a 1.5-acre section of the main beach. "Haute Dogs" later became a regular monthly event.

In 2004, the City Council approved a permanent four-acre dog beach on Ocean Blvd., between Granada and Roycroft Avenues. The Long Beach Dog Zone was officially renamed "Rosie's Dog Beach" in August, 2010, to honor the life of Justin's beloved Rosie the bulldog, the dog who inspired this canine wonderland. The park is open daily from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Know Your Long Beach Parks: El Dorado Nature Center Quarter-Mile Trail



Quarter-mile trail entry

El Dorado Nature Center is a favorite place to walk in Long Beach. Visitors can choose from one and two-mile dirt trails that wind up occasional hills, and a quarter-mile paved trail with wheelchair and stroller access, and a smooth, flat surface. The trail opened in 1994 and features planted areas that represent California climate zones.

Riparian plant communities separate land from water bodies such as rivers, streams, lakes, and ponds. Many of the plants that grow in a wet habitat have unique adaptations to survive changes such as flooding and drought, and can stabilize riverbanks and slow floodwaters. These plants provide food and shelter for many land animals, and include tall trees with deciduous (loose) leaves and shrubby under story plants. The western sycamore, Fremont Cottonwood, cattails, and willows are examples.

Along your walk you will see a grove of Coast Live Oaks in the Woodland area. Acorns from the oak were a main food source for native people, and birds and ground squir-



rels. The leaves on these massive trees are curved, waxy, and spiny, not the familiar lobe shape associated with most oaks. The leaves remain on the tree year-round. When old leaves die and fall to the ground, new leaves sprout on the branches. This part of the walk is very cool and shady.

The Coastal Sage Scrub area has low shrub plants with aromatic leaves that are gray, wooly or sticky such as purple sage, California Buckwheat and California sagebrush. These plants create an important habitat for an array of animals. Coastal Sage Scrub areas are considered endangered ecosystems. One of the keys to its survival are its adaptations to the warm Mediterranean climate of California.
