ENFORCEMENT OF HEALTH ORDER

Effective March 19, 2020 through
Sunday, April 19, 2020 (subject to change)

**Essential
businesses
remain OPEN**



Includes grocery stores, restaurants (drive-thru, take-out, or delivery), health services, pharmacies, banks, and gas stations. Select government services, port operations, airport operations, and critical transportation services will remain open, as will construction of residential and commercial buildings.

**Non-essential
businesses
remain CLOSED**



Includes hair salons, spas, playgrounds, enclosed shopping centers, etc. Community members and businesses that violate or fail to comply with the Long Beach Health Officer's Order may be subject to civil enforcement, which includes but is not limited to, administrative penalties and revocation of a business and/or health permit.

The City of Long Beach asks all community members & businesses to voluntarily comply with the recent "Safer at Home" Health Department order in an effort to keep everyone safe and healthy.

**LBDP calls for service
related to non-compliance**



California Health and Safety Code 120275 et seq. makes it a misdemeanor crime for any individual/business to fail to comply with a local Health Officer's Order. This may be punishable by a fine, imprisonment, or both. If voluntary compliance cannot be obtained, a citation may be issued to individuals or business representatives.
