Reported May 2019 Regarding the January 2019 Meeting

All peace officer personnel records, including information relating to specific deliberations of the Citizen Police Complaint Commission and findings by the City Manager, shall be kept confidential to the extent required by law. In order to comply with this requirement, certain information may have been withheld in this report.

After its **January 10, 2019** meeting, the Citizen Police Complaint Commission submitted recommendations to the City Manager.

The Commission's recommendations and the City Manager's findings for some allegations considered during the **January 10, 2019** meeting are:

**COMMISSION**

- Sustained – 2 allegations
- Other – 1 allegation
- Not Sustained – 6 allegations
- Exonerated - 8 allegations
- Unfounded – 18 allegations
- Receive & File – 0 allegations

**CITY MANAGER**

- Sustained– 2 allegations
- Other – 0 allegations
- Not Sustained – 6 allegations
- Exonerated – 4 allegations
- Unfounded – 22 allegations
- Receive & File – 1 allegation

The Commission submitted requests for the Long Beach Police Department to provide information about the objective standards for using zip ties for handcuffs, including information regarding how tight the zip ties can be placed and how long the zip ties should remain on. The Commission also made a recommendation to revise/update or create a zip tie policy. Additionally, they recommend having a tool to cut/remove the zip ties when handcuffs are placed on.

The Commission also expressed concern about an officer's actions regarding a driver's suspended license and about transporting the driver to the location where there was an active protective order against the driver.

After its **February 14, 2019** meeting, the Citizen Police Complaint Commission submitted recommendations to the City Manager.

The Commission's recommendations and the City Manager's findings for some allegations considered during the **February 14, 2019** meeting are:

**COMMISSION**

- Sustained – 2 allegations
- Other – 6 allegations
- Not Sustained – 1 allegation
- Exonerated - 2 allegations
- Unfounded – 15 allegations
- Receive & File – 2 allegations

**CITY MANAGER**

- Sustained– 0 allegations
- Other – 0 allegations
- Not Sustained – 0 allegations
- Exonerated – 4 allegations
- Unfounded – 19 allegations
- Receive & File – 5 allegations

The Commission expressed that they see many complaints regarding handcuffs being too tight. They submitted requests for the Long Beach Police Department to review and update policy regarding handcuffs. They also request either a comparative analysis of injuries from handcuffs or information about practices regarding handcuffing.
