Subject: 33rd Annual California Coastal Cleanup Day

Long Beach will celebrate California Coastal Cleanup Day on Saturday, September 15, 2018, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.. This annual statewide event draws more than 65,000 volunteers with the common goal of keeping our waterways and coastline clean and healthy.

El Dorado Regional Park and Nature Center will partner with the California Coastal Commission to coordinate the cleanup at five sites in Long Beach. This year's sites include Alamitos Bay Marina, Sea Scout Base (near Mother's Beach), The Peninsula, Belmont Pier, and Cherry Beach. Joining in the effort as site captains are the Aquarium of the Pacific, Seal Beach Yacht Club, the Long Beach Marine Institute, and Clean LB.

Last year, more than 1,000 volunteers in Long Beach removed nearly two tons of debris in just three hours. This year, we strive to increase the number of participants and continue to provide educational materials to the community. Our goal is to inform the public about marine debris issues and inspire local environmental stewardship.


