Subject: Emergency Notification Testing – Alert Long Beach

On November 9, 2018, the Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Communications Department resumed the weekly testing of the Alert Long Beach emergency notification system in Council Districts on a rotating basis. Alert Long Beach is our primary emergency notification system, providing warnings and updates to residents in the event of a major emergency or disaster. The table below shows the dates/addresses (target area) for the tests for the remainder of the year.

Residents will also receive cell phone, email, TDD, text messages, and American Sign Language video, if they provided this information when they signed up for the system.
