RE: Long Beach's 1938 Surfing and Paddleboard Championship "Historic Point of Interest" Designation

Dear Honorable Mayor Richardson,

The Marine Advisory Commission (MAC) assists the Marine Bureau of the City of Long Beach's Park, Recreation and Marine (PRM) Department by formulating requests for projects and programs, and advocates on behalf of Long Beach stakeholders.

The Long Beach site of the 1938 National Surfing and Paddleboard Championship was designated a "Historic Point of Interest" in April 2024 by the State of California's Department of Parks and Recreation. This was the first national surfing competition in the United States.

The MAC heard a presentation by Michael Blum, Sea of Clouds, on July 11, 2024 describing the project and this achievement.

The MAC believes that this designation, within the footprint of the city's historic beaches, falls within the purview of the Marine Bureau. Given the interest and enthusiasm expressed by our commissioners, we have formed a subcommittee to engage with City of Long Beach staff, in partnership with the Long Beach Chapter of Surfrider Foundation, historian Bryce Leisy and Michael Blum of Sea of Clouds, in the hope of supporting and assisting the effort to commemorate this historic site.

The MAC subcommittee is eager to assist in developing ideas for community outreach, design, placement of a plaque or other physical locator to celebrate this "Historic Point of Interest" designation.




