The Planning Project is focused on the annual, & ongoing collaborative & communitywide efforts to develop, implement, operate, & monitor processes to assess, evaluate, identify, quantify, articulate, scope, anticipate, & prepare for the housing, resource, & service needs of persons experiencing homelessness, & persons at-risk of homelessness in the City of LB. To accomplish this the City of LB HSB coordinates & collaborates w/ partnering City agencies, non-profit service providers, housing operators & developers, colleges, school districts, victim service providers, Veteran service providers, mental health service providers, medical providers, as well as persons currently & formerly experiencing homelessness to operate & coordinate the LB CoC, its Board, Lived Experience Board, & subcommittees. The HSB, its Boards, & committees, partner to evaluate, assess, & update the CoC Charter, its by-laws, & policies to ensure that the CoC, its membership, priorities, & goals are reflective of & responsive to interests, needs, & wants of the community, as well as data, research, & evidence-based practices.

The Planning grant provides support to LB in preparing for, coordinating, conducting, evaluating, & reporting the annual PIT & HIC. Planning staff work with the City's Dept. of Development Services (DV) in preparing the City's Con. Plan. HSB staff ensure the Plan captures the range & quality of services for persons who are experiencing or at-risk of homelessness, informing the City's proposals for, as well as utilization, programming, alignment, & coordination of CDBG, HOME, & ESG funding for Prevention, Emergency Shelter, RRH, & Street Outreach.

The UFA coordinates w/ the CoC & DV to ensure that the Homeless Count & HIC data, the resources & gaps of the LB homeless service delivery system as identified by the PIT & HIC, directly inform the City's strategies to address these gaps, including use of the data in the preparation, development, completion, & submission of the annual NOFO & Con. Plan. The UFA & DV coordinate presentations of the HIC & PIT data, the HSB's program & project priorities & rankings, & the Con. Plan for public input, including presentation to & feedback from CoC Board, CoC-funded agencies, Lived Experience Board, & other partnering agencies.

The planning staff coordinates meetings to build the capacity of the CoC throughout the year, developing & evaluating systemwide strategies, evaluating system data & performance, & evaluating & monitoring project performance. The development, alignment, & evaluation of CoC data, performance, & strategy is managed & monitored on an annual & ongoing basis via participation in public, collaborative meetings including CoC subcommittees, Homeless Services Advisory Committee, CoC General Membership & Board meetings, & cross-collaborative meetings w/ other jurisdictions, entities, & departments w/ an intersection in homelessness. Current efforts include expanding stakeholder engagement w/ faith-based providers, those w/ lived experiences of homelessness, & organizations that focus services on BIPOC communities to support the CoC w/ planning for a system that ensures access to, & accessibility of effective, efficient, & quality programming & services designed to end the experience of homelessness in LB.

2. Describe the estimated schedule for the proposed activities, the management plan, and the method for assuring effective and timely completion of all work.

Planning staff meet regularly to review and strategically plan the execution of projects throughout the year. Planning staff maintain timelines for projects, regularly review roles and responsibilities, and reviews policies and procedures for projects to ensure continuity of task completion. These steps are outlined in the UFA’s monitoring and financial guidelines, in addition to the CoC Written Standards and other policies and procedures.

During FY22, the Homeless Services Bureau also led a Board Retreat to collaboratively, and accurately define and describe the qualitative and quantitative goals, needs, and priorities of the CoC and Coordinated Entry System. As result of this retreat, the HSB and Long Beach CoC partnered to develop a strategic plan for FYs 22-24, including the methods, timeline, roles, and responsibilities to address the gaps and needs as identified.

Through the retreat and strategic planning efforts, the CoC collectively identified short-, medium-, and long-term goals to strengthen and improve accessibility, accountability, collaboration, coordination, efficacy, efficiency, equity, fairness, and transparency within and across the Long Beach Continuum of Care and Long Beach Coordinated Entry System. Goals included the establishment of a Lived Experience Board; refinement in data collection, performance standards, and performance monitoring; refinements in Coordinated Entry (access, assessment, matching, and prioritization); and establishment of policies and standards for the provision of homelessness Prevention and shelter diversion. Early successes of the strategic planning effort include the election of Lived Experience Board members, with plan to kick-off the Board by October 2023; the drafting of new monitoring standards, with plans to present to the Board and its Committees for review, feedback, edits, and adoption in November and December 2023; a motion to create a new CES Sub-Committee workgroup to focus on Prevention; a plan to integrate Long Beach HMIS with the BitFocus Clarity system as utilized and administered by the LA HMIS Collaborative; streamlining matching via a centralized community queue, with the CE function built into HMIS by January 2024; and establishment of community case conferencing with all housing and service providers to begin September 2023. Management and completion of the strategic plan and its identified goals and priorities continues as part of the CoC planning efforts, with staff reviewing and monitoring the Strategic Plan as regularly agenda items for discussion and update in CoC Board and Subcommittee meetings, with roles and responsibilities for development and implementation of strategies, practices, standards, and policies to address the goals and needs of the strategic plan shared between HSB staff, the CoC Board, and its members.

3. How will the requested funds improve or maintain the CoC's ability to evaluate the outcome of CoC and ESG projects?

The Planning grant continues to support the expansion and refinement of the homeless service system in Long Beach. The City of Long Beach Homeless Services Bureau partners with its CoC Board, subcommittees, City departments, external funders, community members and partnering agencies to strengthen the Long Beach Continuum of Care and Coordinated Entry System, in order better serve and serve more people experiencing homelessness in Long Beach. This is accomplished via the Homeless Services Bureau’s annual, and ongoing, communitywide collaborative methods and processes to assess and evaluate the scope, scale, characteristics, geography, and demographics, of homelessness; the housing, resource and service needs of people experiencing homelessness; the inventory, availability, accessibility, effectiveness, efficiency, and quality of housing, programs, and services for persons experiencing homelessness; and the housing, resource, and service gaps for persons experiencing homelessness in Long Beach.

The funding is vital in setting the vision for the CoC and its charter, governance, bylaws, policies, and community plan needed to get there. The planning grant also supports the Bureau with the annual and ongoing efforts to develop, coordinate, conduct, and evaluate the Point-in-Time Homeless Count and the Housing Inventory Count and for the CoC to establish gaps analyses and needs assessments to identify the community resources needed within the CoC, and the plan to obtain and deploy resources in order to implement enhanced and expanded programming and services. The Planning grant supports the Bureau and CoC Board with applying the data and findings towards its annual collaborative application, its project priorities, and rankings. The Planning grant, further, supports the Homeless Services Bureau to partner with City departments, service providers, and community partners to develop the annual Consolidated Plan, applying and utilizing PIT and HIC data and the CoC’s community plan in order to identify ESG and CDBG funding and program needs and priorities.

The Planning Grant also supports post-award administrative activities pertaining to evaluating and monitoring performance of the CoC’s programs and contracted services, and enforcing compliance with HUD and CoC regulations, policies, and statutes. The CoC leverages the Planning Grant to pursue additional funding opportunities and partnerships in alignment with the plans and goals as identified through the community plan, to augment and support the HSB, CoC, and Long Beach Coordinated Entry System.
