FROM THE MANAGER

Can't believe it is July, where did the last six months go?

For those that may not have heard, the Marina Revenue Bonds, Series 2015 sold in ten minutes! Wednesday, May 20, 2015, was an exciting day for us. The market opened at 7:30 a.m. pacific standard time and by 7:40 a.m. we had offers for well over this amount, resulting in a lower interest rate. The funds were deposited on June 3, 2015, of which \$61 million was used to pay off the outstanding Department of Boating & Waterways (DBW) loans and \$49 million will be applied towards the completion of the Alamitos Bay Marina. Staff is currently working with Bellingham Marine Industries on a proposed timeline for Basins 3, 6 and 7. I anticipate going before City Council to appropriate the funds and extend the construction contract in August 2015.

I'd like to take a moment to discuss how the Long Beach Board of Water Commissioners Stage 2 Water Supply Short-

age declaration on May 11, 2015 for the City of Long Beach affects us at the marinas. The Marine Bureau is being asked to reduce water usage by 25 percent. Therefore, while the rules do not specifically list marinas, I am asking that in the spirit of goodwill everyone cooperate with the following **prohibitions**:

1. Washing vessels, docks, finger or other outdoor areas with a hose unless using a water-conserving pressurized cleaning device (a water-conserving pressurized cleaning device shall discharge water at a minimum of 1,000 pounds per square inch or be rated at using less than three (3) gallons of water per minute). A simple spray nozzle does not qualify as a water-conserving pressurized cleaning device.
2. Washing a vessel with a hose when the hose does not have a water shut-off nozzle or device attached to it or allowing a hose to run continuously while washing

Back by popular demand will be the 3rd of July "Big Bang Block Party." This is a spectacular night to remember with a vintage fly over, sky divers, and pyrotechnics blasting off from a barge in the middle of the bay, giving spectators a close-up view from the bay's shores and all along the Peninsula, Naples and, most festively, from the Big Bang Block Party and around The Boathouse on the Bay.

And, making things better all-around is the fact that the Block Party benefits the Action Sports Kids (ASK) Foundation. ASK empowers kids through sports, education, art and community.

This year's celebration starts at 5PM, with Block Party seating and dinner starting at \$40 (\$60 gets you inside the restaurant and \$100 gets you on the patio). The Long Beach Fire Department's Marine Safety Division will once again sponsor the Junior Lifeguard Program this summer. The 2015 Program will be held June 29 to August 7. Marine Safety Captain Scott Dixon and Marine Safety Sgt. Jeff Gillott along with a full cadre of instructors will be leading our Junior Lifeguard program this summer with 536 kids signed up. As always, there will be two sessions to the program. Each session will be held Monday through Friday at

Junior Lifeguard Headquarters, located on the beach at 55th Place and Ocean Blvd.

The Junior Lifeguard Program offers students 9 to 17 years of age the opportunity to receive instruction in Lifeguard rescue technique, emergency medical first-aid, ocean sports activity, physical conditioning, marine ecology, and public service. Field trips and competitions at other area beaches will highlight the six (6) week course. All aspects of beach activity will be explored from beach running to skin diving. The program is presented in a manner that will enable each student to participate to the best of his or her abilities while acquiring new skills and abilities.

When others are challenged in completing their responsibilities, Jose is always willing to step up – often working late or arriving early to work – to ensure that all workloads are completed with the highest standards.

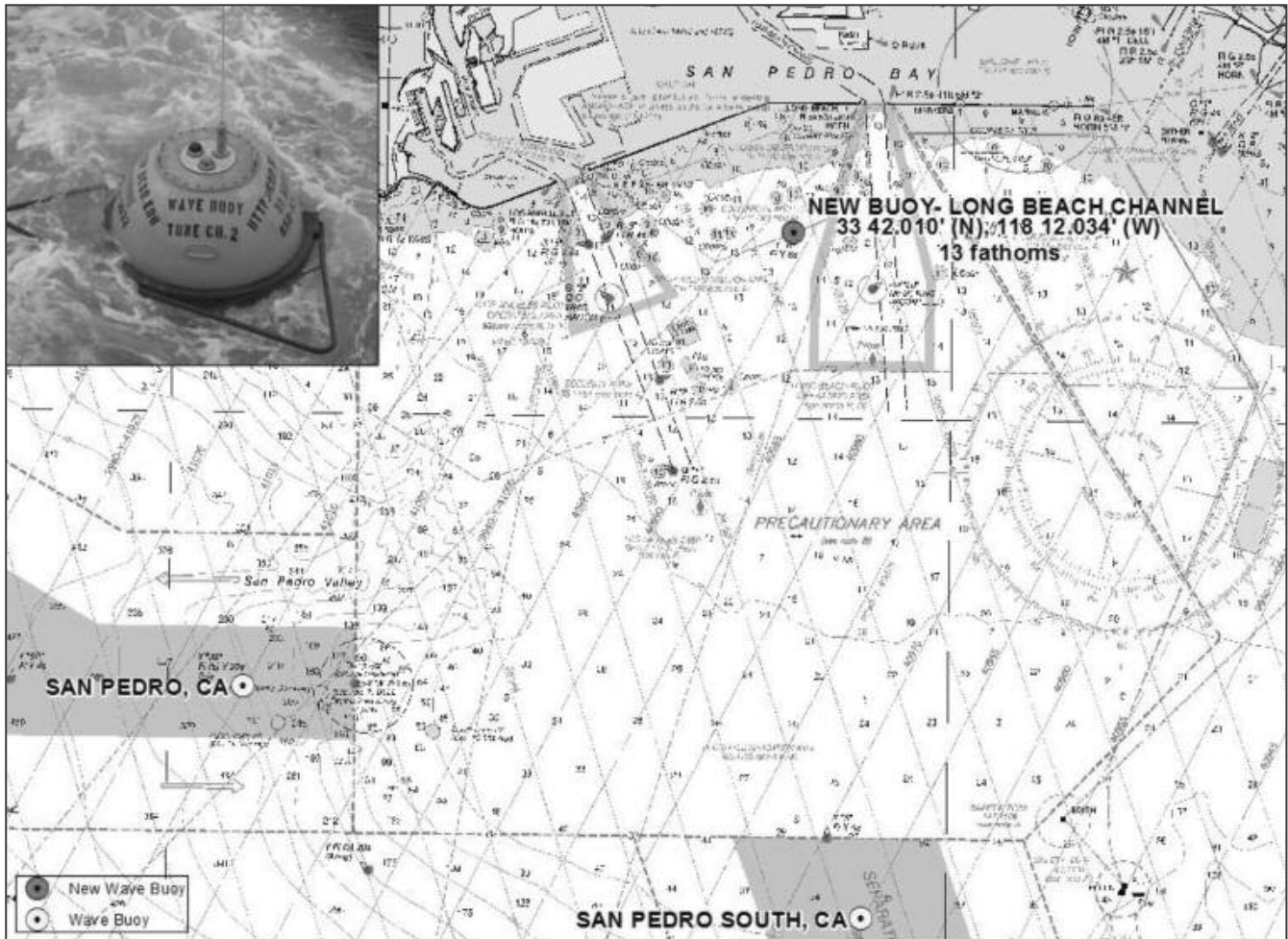

The wave height reported is the "significant" wave height (H_s) which represents the average of the 1/3 highest waves. Approximately double the H_s to obtain the maximum wave height.

At night time, the buoy will emit a yellow color Coast Guard compliant flashing light.
