The month of May has been declared "Long Beach Citywide Spring Cleaning Month," a new, month-long initiative that will beautify beaches, parks and public spaces through a series of hosted community cleanup events. The events will activate and uplift neighborhoods throughout the city by encouraging community members to participate in or host a cleanup.

At a kickoff event on May 1, volunteers from the Long Beach Conservation Corps, alongside City staff, conducted a beach cleanup. Beach Maintenance Division positioned their front loader and tractor towing a sanitizing machine, equipment used to lift heavy debris and clean and sift sand.

to celebrate in all of our senior centers. Community Recreation Services has planned and calendared many great personal enrichment classes and social gatherings. At the May 7 Council meeting, we asked for a presentation and proclamation of May is Older American's Month. Mother Nature has been kinder to us during the month of May when we also celebrate Mother's Day and head towards the end of the school year with Memorial Day holiday always seemingly ushering in summertime in Long Beach.

This year's Sowing the Seeds 5th Annual Fundraising Event for the Partners of Park was held inside the El Dorado Nature Center as a result of inclement weather. The event set a new attendance record and the indoor setting was ideal for social interaction, healthy Silent Auction action, enjoyable entertainment provided by the Jazz Angels, and a final special gathering of the POP Board and community supporters of our non-profit partner to express our appreciation for the half decade of successful leadership by outgoing Executive Director Trinkia Rowsell. Major accomplishments of Partners of Parks under Trinkia's leadership included a new Strategic Plan, expanded board representation, increases to the scholarship programs,

and the funding of the replacement of the Admiral Kidd Park Playground. The search for a new Executive Director is underway with interviews of top candidates under consideration to be scheduled before summer. Best wishes to Trinkia in all of her future endeavors.

Speaking of the changing of the guard in terms of leadership, May 23rd holds a special event on our PRM calendar as we celebrate the tremendous term of service of Hurley Owens, our current Park Maintenance Operations Bureau Manager. Hurley announced his retirement last month and we will be expressing our appreciation for the impact upon the maintenance quality of our park system during his many years of leadership. Best wishes and great enjoyment to Hurley in his retirement years ahead.

New wayfinding and directional signage have been introduced into El Dorado East Regional Park in the areas of the Nature Center, Animal Care Services, the Long Beach Community Gardens, and Park Maintenance Operations Bureau's yard. Additional signage that follows the City of Long Beach 'style guide' for colors, lettering, and graphics will be installed in the park across Spring Street in conjunction with roadway and parking area improvements.

Mayor Richardson has announced that a Citywide Spring Cleaning program for May 2024 will be coordinated by Public Works, Community Development, and PRM. Volunteer opportunities will abound in all nine Council Districts. We currently have twelve parks' "Friends" groups that are operating under the umbrella of Partners of Parks that would be ideal volunteer groups to organize a park cleanup event as part of the Citywide Spring Cleaning initiative.

As May helps generate a lot of community excitement for the upcoming summer season, I am thankful for the hundreds of part time, seasonal staff who will be joining the PRM team. EL DORADO NATURE CENTER EARTH DAY CLEAN UP EVENT
